The original front section of this stone and brick house has a gambrel roof with a central flying gable to the street (east) facade with a finial and pendant. Surrounding the gable, a bullnose verandah is supported on turned timber posts. The stone work to the original section is finely pointed with red brick quoining and arches to the openings and matching brick quoining to the corners. Windows to the front section are timber framed and casement style with a transom light. A tall brick chimney is situated to the south of the front section. To the rear, a large brick extension has a gable roof with a finial and weatherboard infill to the gable end. The house is separated from the street by a tall limestone block wall.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Although set behind a limestone wall, this house has many decorative elements such as the pointed stonework with brick quoining, turned timber verandah posts, flying gable and bullnose verandah which are easily viewed from the street. Given this, the place has aesthetic appeal and makes a positive contribution to the streetscape of the area.
