The shop front of this building is constructed of rendered brick and fronts directly on to the street. The street facade has an art deco stepped parapet which has a cantilevered box awning attached. Below, there are large modern glass windows, a recessed entry door and the masonry is tiled below the windows to one metre height. Extending from the rear of the shop, a hipped corrugated iron roof covers a timber frame corrugated iron and weatherboard residence.
