This brick house has a colorbond gambrel roof with small finials to the apexes of the roof gablets. The front facade is enhanced by a gable to the north east which has a pressed metal and batten gable end with a finial to the apex. A separate hipped verandah roof supported on turned timber posts fronts the east facade. The face brickwork is tuckpointed with a rendered masonry band to half window height. Windows are double hung and casement style with lead lights to the entry door. A corbelled brick chimney is situated to the north of the main roof and a garage in sympathetic style is situated to the north of the house. A masonry pier and iron infill fence forms the front boundary of the property.
