This large stone and concrete block building has a large gable roof with a smaller gable roof to the front concrete block section. A surrounding hipped verandah is supported on timber posts mounted on masonry columns with masonry balustrade infill. The rear stone section features rendered sills and lintels to openings while the concrete block section has rusticated concrete block quoining accentuated by the paint treatment of the corners. The building has french doors and a combination of casement and double hung windows. The place was almost identical to the building located at 75 Forrest Street which was demolished in 1997.

#### STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This restaurant, former residence, is one of a series of buildings of similar style along the north side of Forrest Street (Numbers 69, 71/73, 77/79 & 81). To the street facade, the buildings have matching elements such as verandahs set near the footpath, quoining or gable ends which have simple decorative elements. Each of the buildings contributes to provide the unique streetscape of Forrest Street which should be considered as a precinct with development considerations made accordingly.
