This duplex pair is of brick construction with hipped corrugated iron roofs separated by a small rendered parapet wall. A small gable enhances the street elevation. Brickwork is painted to the front facade and pointed to the sides. The separate verandah roof is supported on turned timber posts. Windows are double hung and there is a lean-to to the rear. The place is almost identical to 71-73 Forrest Street.

The building was extended in 1982 to include four extra rooms, toilets and a staff room. The front verandah was timber which was changed to concrete due to white ant damage. This propoerty was purchased directly from Ray Armitage (Owner Knowledge) Most of Forrest Street was part of the Estate of R. Armitage from the 1930s to about 1970.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This pair of semi detached offices, is one of a series of buildings of similar style along the north side of Forrest Street (Numbers 69, 71/73, 77/79 & 81). To the street facade, the buildings have matching elements such as verandahs set near the footpath, quoining or gable ends which have simple decorative elements. Each of the buildings contributes to provide the unique streetscape of Forrest Street which should be considered as a precinct with development considerations made accordingly.
