This house was demolished c2006. The following description is from the 1997 Municipal Inventory: This timber framed house has a gambrel roof with a separate hipped verandah roof to the front (west) which is supported on chamfered timber posts. There is a small fibro clad lean-to to the rear. The ends of the verandah are enclosed with trellis with lattice balustrades. The front facade of the building is clad in weatherboard with fibro to the sides. Windows are timber framed and double hung. There is a brick chimney to the north. A picket fence runs along the north boundary of the property.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Although the place had been partly reclad, it nevertheless still retained much of its original form and fabric such as the corbelled chimney, steeply pitched roof and verandah form. As such the place made a high contribution to the streetscape of the locale. Further it was a good example of weatherboard construction of this era, which is becoming increasingly rare.
