This painted rendered stone house is set above, and fronts directly onto, the street. A tiled hipped roof extends to cover the front (west) verandah supported on Tuscan style concrete columns set on rendered masonry piers with a rendered masonry capped balustrade. Entry to the verandah is via three concrete steps to a picket gate. There are two painted rendered corbelled chimneys which punctuate the roofscape and there is a lean-to roof to the rear.

Although the roof cladding and verandah have been altered, the original simple form of the building is still evident as well as built features such as two tall corbelled chimneys. Given this the place has aesthetic value and contributes positively to the streetscape of the area.
