This large house has a gambrel corrugated iron roof with two separate gables to the front (west) and south elevations. The front gable has fibro and batten infill to the gable end and extends to form a bay. The eaves of the gable each side of the bay are supported on timber consoles. The main roof extends to cover verandahs to the front and south sides of the house. The verandah roof is supported on double Tuscan columns on masonry piers with a rendered masonry balustrade. The south west corner of the verandah has been enclosed with timber windows above the balustrade. The face brickwork is tuckpointed with rendered bands immediately below the eaves and to window head and sill height. There is an arched concrete lintel to the bay window which has an arched triple transom light with central fixed and lateral casement windows below. There are two rendered brick corbelled chimneys to the main roof north and south. Entry to the verandah is via six concrete steps with a low balustrade to each side. The front boundary has a low rendered masonry wall which curves from the street to form the entry via a low metal gate.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The house has historic significance for its connection with the Fong family. The place has aesthetic appeal given that many of the original decorative features such as the verandah supports, face brickwork with rendered banding and corbelled chimneys have been retained. As such the house makes a high contribution to the streetscape of the area.
