This stone house fronts directly on to the street and has a hipped corrugated iron roof punctuated by a plain chimney to the north east. The verandah to the front (west) has a hipped roof and is supported on chamfered timber posts. The stone work to the front of the building is semi coursed and pointed with voussoirs to the window arches. To the sides the stonework is pointed random rubble with red brick to window openings. A two storey addition has been constructed to the rear. There is a picket fence to the footpath.
