Lester Square Park is a small open park situated on the corner of Gregory and Augustus Street. The park is fenced with pine poles and there is play equipment in the centre of the park.

HISTORY

On 7 February, 1932 Lester Square Park was officially opened by the Mayor, George Lester, after whom the park was named. (K. Gallaher, "List of openings, inaugurations, foundations", Local Studies Collection of Geraldton Library)

Prior to this the land was used for Tetlow's Pound, where animals such as goats were impounded. In addition it was used as a Police garden. (Stan Gratte)

Local sources indicate that Anzac Day services were held in Lester Square Park for several years until Birdwood House was built in 1935. ("Geraldton Guardian and Express", 25/4/1936)
