Set in an elevated position this is a timber framed weatherboard clad house. The tiled gambrel roof has a separate gable to the front room. The main roof extends to cover the front verandah which is supported on timber posts. The front verandah has a balustrade featuring horizontal timber plank infill. This is one in a group of three similar WAGR houses, see also 28 and 32 Bayly Street.

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## STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This fmr railway worker's house, along with those located at 28 and 32 Bayly Street, has some historic significance for its association with the railway yards in Geraldton which have since been removed from the Geraldton foreshore. The place is representative of the simple style of construction evident in railway housing throughout the state as well as the way in which the houses were grouped together. The group of houses contributes to the streetscape of Bayly Street.
