## STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This fmr railway worker's house, along with 28 and 30 Bayly Street, has some historic significance for its association with the Geraldton railway yards which have since been removed from the Geraldton foreshore. The place is characteristic of the simple style of construction typical of railway housing in the state as well as the way in which the houses were grouped together. The group of houses contributes to the streetscape of Bayly Street.
