This stone house has a hipped corrugated iron roof with a lean-to roof to the rear. There is a separate verandah roof to the street facade which is supported on brick verandah pillars. The stone is coursed to the front wall and random to the sides, while rendered quoining enhances the openings and corners of the building. There is a 10 pane central entry door with 10 pane panels each side. Windows are timber framed and double hung. A high brick wall with central timber gates forms the street frontage of the place.
