Fronting on to Chapman Road this stone building has a hipped corrugated iron roof with a separate gable to the front with a bay front below. A separate bullnose verandah which is entirely enclosed with glass sliding doors extends across the whole front facade. Decorative elements include brick quoining to window openings and a tall corbelled chimney to the south. There is a small fibro clad extension to the rear.

Local sources indicate that this house was built by local builder Mr Bennett who also had his workshop there. The place was at one time owned by Henry Thuys. It is reputedly the first house in Geraldton to have electricity. (Cook, V., "Way Back When", 1907)
