This house is situated in an elevated position and has a gambrel aluminium tiled roof with closed gablets and a chimney to the south east. The house is timber framed with painted weatherboard cladding. The main roof extends to cover the surrounding verandahs which are supported on timber posts with decorative braces. A timber balustrade with simple balusters runs between the verandah posts. There is lattice infill to the south west corner of the verandah. Entry from the street is via two sets of concrete steps with a landing between. The timber balustrade to the steps matches that on the verandah. The timber framed windows are casement style with french doors to the west verandah and a central timber entry door to the north. There is a windmill on the property and a garage (set on a lower level) to the west.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house has considerable aesthetic significance given its prominent, elevated position in the heart of a heritage precinct, its style incorporating surrounding verandahs and steeply pitched roof as well as decorative features including verandah brackets and balustrading. Although the original roofing material has been replaced, the house remains a good example of its type and era. Furthermore it is a good example of weatherboard construction which is becoming increasingly rare in Geraldton and this rarity value enhances the significance of the place.
