This timber framed house has a hipped zincalume roof with broken back extensions which cover the verandahs to the front (west) and north. To the rear there is a lean-to roof and to the south west a separate gable roof covers the main room. The house is clad with weatherboard to window sill height with fibro above and fibro and timber batten to the gable end. The front verandah is supported on timber posts with a timber balustrade between. The north verandah is enclosed with weatherboard below and windows above. The windows to the gable and south side have corrugated iron awnings. There is a small brick chimney to the north east and a carport with a lean-to roof is attached to the north side.
