#### **DESCRIPTION**

This place consists of two adjoining buildings - a shop and a residence.

FORMER SHOP: This small square rendered stone building fronts directly on to the street and has a steeply pitched aluminium tiled hipped roof. The front facade has double timber entry doors with double hung windows each side. Decorative wrought iron security grilles have been installed to the windows. Openings are enhanced with additional rendering.

RESIDENCE: This ashlar rendered stone building's verandah fronts directly onto the street. The main roof is hipped aluminium tile and it extends with a shallower pitch to cover the front verandah. The verandah is supported on half timber posts on brick piers with a brick balustrade. Between the verandah posts there is an arched timber frieze and the south end of the verandah has some weatherboard infill. There are rendered masonry chimneys to the south and south west, the latter has had a tall brick extension added. Windows are timber framed casement style.

Photographic evidence reveals that this building was used as the premises

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of the Western Australian Bank in the early years of settlement in Geraldton. According to a previous owner the building has been used as a chemist, post office and bank over the years. He claims that the verandahs of the former shop were removed during a "tidy up" of the town for a visit by Queen Elizabeth II.

In 2007-08 the buildings were under restoration together with the adjacent Honeymoon Cottage.

## STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

These two buildings, comprising a single room (former bank) and attached cottage, have historic significance for their connection to early commercial activities in Geraldton. Further they have considerable aesthetic significance as they demonstrate the use of local materials and are representative of structures of their era. The buildings make an important contribution to the built environment of the locale which includes a number of buildings of a similar age and style. Each structure enhances the significance of the other and therefore they should be considered as a whole.
