This simple square rendered stone building fronts directly on to the street. The corrugated iron hipped roof is steeply pitched with a small skillion roof to a brick extension to the rear. There is a small chimney to the extension. There is a timber framed casement window to the south and a double hung window set below the eaves to the east facade. There is a large brick shopfront extension, set back from the street, to the north.
