This stone building has a hipped corrugated iron roof with a separate gable extending beyond a bay to the main room (south east) to form a verandah. To the rear the main roof has a skillion roof running to the west beyond which is a large extension with a skillion roof running to the south. The gable end has roughcast finish with timber batten, below which is a fibro and timber frieze. The gable is supported on chamfered timber posts. The stonework is painted with ashlar finish to the building frontage. The bay has three windows, while to the north east, tall french doors have narrow tall windows to each side. Windows to the house are timber framed and double hung. To the north and south of the main roof there are two painted stone chimneys with large corbelling to the top and a label mould below.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Although large additions have been made to the rear of the building, the place still retains its original style and form to the front. Built elements such as the corbelled chimney, bay and french windows and decorative gable end combine to give the place high streetscape value. The place also demonstrates the use of local materials.
