This house is set back from the street to the north west corner of Lester Park. This small stone cottage with a steeply pitched corrugated iron roof has had two gables added to the front facade including a large one which covers the front (east) verandah. The verandah is supported on timber posts. The gable ends are enclosed with fibro. Windows are casement style with leadlights to the front. A chimney punctuates the apex of the gable. A low rendered masonry fence with piers and timber picket infill runs across the property frontage.
