This stone house is set close to the street with the verandah balustrade forming the street boundary. A steeply pitched corrugated iron roof has a gable roof to the south west which covers a timber framed fibro clad extension. A separate bull nose hipped verandah to the front (east) and south east is supported on chamfered timber posts with a plank balustrade with some fibro infill to the south east. There is a rendered brick chimney to the south east. Windows are timber framed and double hung. The house is painted blue.
