This painted brick house has a white hipped colorbond roof with a separate gable roof to the front (east) elevation which covers the main room. The gable end has fibro and batten infill with consoles to the eaves. The main roof has a hipped broken back extension which covers verandahs to the front and north of the place. The front verandah is supported on timber posts, the north east corner and north sides are enclosed with fibro. Below the gable, a corrugated iron awning covers the window to the main room. Windows to the house are small pane timber framed casement style, with aluminium framed windows to the verandah infill. Access to the verandah is via steps with metal balustrade. A low asbestos fence with a picket gate forms the street boundary.

Rates Records indicate that in 1918 this land was owned by the Agricultural Society and the house was built c1928 for Thomas Greenaway. In the early 1930s until 1945 the Green's lived in this house, and possibly owned it.
