Set on a hillside, this timber framed weatherboard clad house has a corrugated iron gambrel roof with a skillion roof to the rear (south) and separate hipped bull nose verandah to the front. The verandah is supported on timber posts with a criss-cross balustrade. Windows are a mixture of timber framed double hung and casement styles with french doors to the front verandah. Entry to the verandah is via two steps. There is a rendered brick chimney to the south east and the front boundary has a low rendered masonry wall.
