This two storey rendered brick building fronts directly on to the street with the reinstated verandahs crossing the footpath. To the front elevation ground floor there are two shops with large shop windows and entry doors set back from the street. Between the shops are centrally placed double timber entry doors which provide access to the second storey. A double storey verandah runs the entire length of the building. The second storey has a rendered masonry parapet with a plain centrally placed triangular pediment above. The windows to the first floor are timber framed, with three french doors. The masonry building is painted blue.

HISTORY

This two storey building was built for Pat Stone, a one time MLA in 1896-97. In January 1897, it was advised that the store was almost complete and ready for opening. (Jim Lowrie, "A Mixed Bag of Things that Happened over the Years") In 1907 this was Pat Stone's Store and residence. (Source: Shirley Scotter). It should be noted that the Geraldton Foreshore Conservation Plan has conflicting historical information about this place. It is recommended that further research and investigation be undertaken to

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The building makes an important contribution to the built environment of the central business district given its large scale and built features such as the triangular pediment, decorative parapet and french doors. It is one of only a few two storey buildings of that era in this section of Marine Terrace. Furthermore the place has some historic significance for its association with commercial activities since around the turn of the century.
