Modifications:

The Post Office was demolished in 1979 and the site was left vacant, accommodating a public square. Stone from the original building was used to build a screen wall set back from the building line. The wall consists of stone piers and spandrels, the the decorative capitals from the original Post Office arcade used as pier tops. A number of plaques have been fixed to the walls commemorating the Batavia and Zeewijk. The former Post Office clock was reused in a new Rotary Clock Tower, a feature of the Marine Terrace Mall.

By January 1893 the foundations had been laid for Geraldton's new Post Office building. Costing approximately 3,000 pounds, the building incorporated post and telegraph offices and the Post Master's residence. The new Post Office was opened on 11 December 1893. The building comprised two storeys with an ornate tower which was added in 1914. Private mail boxes were located to the right of the building and the telephone exchange was sited on the second floor on the left hand side. A new post office was constructed in Chapman Road in 1975, following

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which the original building was left vacant prior to being demolished in 1979. Local stone mason, Sam Sciuto used stone from the original building to construct the screen wall at the rear of the new public square. ("Geraldton: a Photographic History")


