STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This two storey building has social significance for its use as a guesthouse for a number of years. Although altered and added to the place nevertheless has aesthetic appeal given its simple design and parapet mouldings and therefore contributes to the streetscape of the locale. RECOMMENDATION:

Many of the buildings on Marine Terrace, between Cathedral Avenue and Fitzgerald Street, have high streetscape value due to their similar scale, style, retention of decorative features and period of construction. Consideration should be given to recognising this area as a precinct with encouragement given to owners to enhance the heritage values of the buildings.
