Situated on a prominent corner this is a large two storey painted rendered ashlar stone building. The ground floor contains three shops with a suspended box awning to part of the Marine Terrace frontage. The corner shop has large timber framed windows and an entry door. The second storey has timber framed double hung windows and a doorway indicating the removal of original double storey verandahs. Part of the building fronting Fitzgerald Street is built at a lower level. A plain parapet wall runs around the building.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Although this two storey building has had much of its decorative elements such as its parapet wall and verandah removed, it nevertheless makes a high contribution to the streetscape of this locale given its large scale, prominent corner location and ashlar design to the ground floor. Further the place has some historic significance given its association with commercial activities in Geraldton for many years.

RECOMMENDATION:

Many of the buildings on Marine Terrace, between Cathedral Avenue and Fitzgerald Street, have high streetscape value due to their similar scale, style, retention of decorative features and period of construction. Consideration should be given to recognising this area as a precinct with encouragement given to owners to enhance the heritage values of the buildings.
