Set back from the street this stone building partly adjoins the building at 285 Marine Terrace and has side walls finished with rough-cast render. It has a steeply pitched corrugated iron gable roof with a small brick chimney to the rear. The gable end has a turned finial and timber brackets to the barge boards with infill of roughcast above and render below. A small timber framed window is set below the brackets. The front elevation has a bullnose verandah which is supported on timber posts and has a low metal balustrade to the south. Windows are timber framed and double hung with french doors to the verandah. The front of the place has an old grape vine supported on a timber trellis.

This building once housed Shepheard's 'Pig and Whistle Brewery'. (C. Norris, "Memories of Champion Bay or Old Geraldton", p.90) On 17 May 1871, "The Inquirer" states that this property was up for auction. Rates records indicate that the property was owned by Charles Walch (1900-1908), Sarah Davies (1908-1922) and Mrs W. Bourke (1922-1925). (Source: Ron Bertelsen)
