This brick building has a colorbond gambrel roof with a separate hipped roof to the street elevation. A separate verandah roof is supported on timber posts. There is a custom orb metal awning to the window of the main room. Windows are timber framed and double hung with two panes above and below. There is a corbelled brick chimney to the rear and a small rendered brick wall to the street boundary. The brickwork to the front facade is painted.

Although this simple brick cottage, now used as a shop, has had some alterations over time, it nevertheless retains much of its original fabric such as the roof structure and corbelled chimney. Given this the place contributes to the streetscape of the locale.
