This L-shaped painted brick building has a multi hipped colorbond roof. The main entry addresses the corner and is enhanced by a rendered moulding painted in a contrasting colour. There are two large timber framed shop windows to each side of the corner entry door and a smaller window to the south east corner.

Rates records indicate that the vacant land was owned by Robert Darling between 1900 and 1906-07, and then by David Arundel Smith between 1907-08 and 1925. The records list the land as being vacant up until 1911-12. The 1912-13 rates records show a building on the lot which was listed as being a shop and dwelling. The tenants have included Mrs J. Routledge (1914-16) and Mrs Elizabeth Burt (1916-17 to 1925). This building has been used as a grocers store with post and telegraph facilities. Further, it is representative of similar corner shops in both the town and other regional areas.
