This timber framed house has a narrow corrugated iron gable roof which covers a single room to the front. To the rear the roof expands to cover a room and entrance way. To the rear elevation, a lean-to roof covers a corrugated iron extension. The south side of the house has colorbond cladding with weatherboard to the west. To the front (west), the gable end is enclosed with fibro and timber battens. Below the gable end, a bull nose verandah is supported on timber posts with a fibro balustrade and is enclosed with corrugated iron to the south side.
