This stone and brick building has a hipped corrugated iron roof. The front (north) elevation is of tuck pointed brick construction and features two bays each side of the central entry door. The front bullnose verandah is supported on turned timber posts. Windows are timber framed and double hung. There is a rendered addition to the rear. A picket fence forms the property frontage.
