Centrally located in the small town of Walkaway this former store is of concrete block construction with a hipped corrugated iron roof. The front (west) elevation still reveals the building's use as a shop, there being two large display windows. The roof is punctuated by a corbelled brick chimney to the south.

The store, located opposite the Railway Station (Place No. 132), was established by Ned Hackett in 1910. After Ned's death in 1913, the store was managed by his widow. In the Geraldton Express 20/09/1926 there is a photograph of the store, then operated by R. Martin. Martin disposed of his business at Walkaway in 1932.
