2004/5 Review: The dam is located approximately 100 metres west of the Padbury Road, Road Closed Reserve. The concrete lined structure is about 40 metres by 40 metres, about 10-12 metres deep and has banks sloping at 45 degrees. To the south-west is the catchment area with remnants of bitumen still to be found on the surface. The dam and catchment area are surrounded by a row of mature sugar gums (Eucalyptus cladocalyx).
