Well Station formed part of a large tract of land in the Greenough area taken up during the middle of the 1800s by the Cattle Company, a partnership of Messrs Edward Hamersley, Samual Phillips and Lockier Burges. When the Cattle Company dissolved Edward Hamersley retained the Greenough holdings which included Well Station. Phillips and Burges took the Irwin holdings. At the turn of the century Well Station was inherited by Hugh Edward Hamersley, grandson of Edward, who added to the property with other land. He used the holding for raising beef cattle. Soon after Hugh married Edith Maud Gould and they had three sons and a daughter. In 1909 Hugh Hamersley had extensive additions made to Well Homestead by Messrs Delmage & Co, Dongara. In 1935 Hugh Edward died and the property was managed by his second son Edward until the end of the war. From this time on until 1968 Well Station was run by Marion and Kevin Carr. The property was later owned by Leonard and Jane Hamersley who restored the homestead.
