Dale Farmhouse is a rendered stone building, painted white, with a hipped corrugated iron roof. The roof extends to cover surrounding verandahs which are supported on brick pillars. The verandah is partly enclosed with brick to the north-east corner. The entrance to the house is enhanced by a small gable which protrudes to the north and is also supported on brick pillars. The roof is punctuated by a corbelled brick chimney. The house features brick quoining to openings and casement style windows. Immediately to the west of the house is a stone outbuilding which has a corrugated iron gable roof and lean-to roofs to the east and north. Located some distance to the west of the house is a stone cottage which has a hipped corrugated iron roof. The roof extends to cover a verandah to the east which is supported on timber posts. The verandah is partly enclosed with corrugated iron sheeting. There is also a small verandah to the west elevation. The place has two chimneys, one to the north and one to the south. A large Moreton Bay Fig tree is located immediately in front of the cottage.

All three buildings are evidence of the simple style of construction which was characteristic of the area at the time as well as the use of local materials.
