The property originally belonged to Mr Bennett, a builder, before being sold to George Sewell. The cottage is believed to have been built in the 1890s. It is thought that Cold Comfort Farm was originally used as a coaching station to change horse teams enroute to Mullewa. Alec Grant established a stud farm on the property and built the concrete block buildings c1925. During World War II these buildings were used by the army. A main residence was constructed to the North of Cold Comfort Farm in 2005.
