#### DESCRIPTION

Located at the end of Phillips Road on the west side of the Greenough River, Rose Cottage is a four-roomed stone house with a hipped corrugated iron roof. Evidence remains of a separate verandah roof to the front facade which has been removed, while the verandah to the south elevation remains intact, although in poor condition. The building features brick quoining to corners and openings and the front facade is enhanced by pointed stonework. Two rendered and moulded chimneys punctuate the roof; the curved moulding being similar to the chimney on Kelly's Cottage [Place No. 7]. The original french doors located either side of the central doorway have been replaced by full length aluminium framed windows. Entry steps featuring decorative rendered columns lead up to the doorway, via the removed verandah. There is a brick and fibro lean-to at the rear.

2004/04 Review: In recent years considerable work has been carried out to the building including the reinstatement of the verandah roof and floor to the east and south elevations.

F.W. Smith took up the title to VL 229 in 1869. He advertised the place for sale in 1893. It was described as having several fruit trees and 3 wells. Initially living at Raphoe (Place No. 20), Isabella Duncan built Rose Cottage on the property when her eldest son married. Isabella lived at Rose Cottage with her eldest daughter, Mary, who had never married, while her son David, took over farming at Raphoe. Mary died in 1927 and Isabella in 1940. Cyril and Ivy Ducas briefly lived in the cottage after Cyril was discharged from the Air Force. The cottage was later abandoned until bought by the current owners who have restored the building and reinstated the verandahs to the east and south elevations. # STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Rose Cottage has some local historic significance for its association with the Duncan Family. The place has considerable aesthetic appeal given its use of local stone and detailing such as the brick quoining and moulded chimneys, which gives it more sophistication than the simple stone cottages prevalent in the area.
