## **DESCRIPTION**

The Meru siding consists of a platform built from two parallel limestone walls up to 1 metre in height. There is evidence on the platform of 4 interconnecting stone walls 6 metres apart. The spaces between these walls has been filled with gravel. The west wall shows evidence of squared mortar. The platform is now 4 metres from the existing railway track, of which 75 metres remain in place.

This platform was built as part of the Geraldton-Walkaway railway line in 1886. At that time is was hoped the siding would later become an important suburban station. The platform served as the siding for the Geraldton Race Course from 1887 to c1922.

The section of railway line between Meru and Geraldton was removed in 2005.

# STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Meru railway siding has historic significance for its connection with rail transport in the district from the late 1880s. With the removal of the original railway track between Meru and Geraldton this site is now a significant indicator of the former location of that track. The site also has important social significance for its use in conjunction with the nearby former Victoria Turf Club site.
