The site of Crampton Siding is believed to be on or near CG726, within close proximity of the Greenough Farmer's Club Hall [Place No. 73].

HISTORY

In 1894 Perth and Geraldton were linked by rail when the Midland Railway Company line reached Walkaway. The route of the railway through Walkaway and along the Back Flats was a cause of considerable debate and ultimately resulted in a lessening of the importance of the Front Flats. The Crampton Siding, originally known as the Greenough Road Siding, was used by residents of the Front Flats. It was also the main thoroughfare for travellers to the Greenough Agricultural Show, which was held nearby.
