This cottage appears to be of concrete block construction which has been clad on the west and north elevations with stone. The place has a hipped corrugated iron roof which extends to cover the front (west) verandah which is supported on timber posts. There is a lean-to roof to the rear. Windows are timber framed and casement in style with small panes and timber lintels over. French doors provide the main entry to the front of the house. A rendered chimney is located to the north.
