STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The ruin of Poole's Cottage has some historic significance as evidence of the settlement and development of the Greenough Flats. The place is characteristic of the simple stone structures which are prevalent in the district. The prominent position of the place at the end of the Greenough Flats enhances its contribution to the historic character of the locale.
