Located immediately to the east of the railway line near the intersection of Edward and Bruce Roads, this stone house has a steeply pitched corrugated iron gable roof which extends to cover the front (north) verandah. The verandah is supported on timber posts and is partly enclosed with fibro, lattice and shade cloth. There is a corrugated iron clad lean-to to the rear. The roof is punctuated by two rendered and moulded chimneys. The house still has original double hung timber windows and features an air vent to the gable end. There is a small timber framed corrugated iron clad shed with a curved roof located immediately behind the house.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Station Master's House at Narngulu has considerable historic significance for its connection with rail transport in the district from the 1880s. The building is characteristic of railway houses and has a high degree of aesthetic appeal given its use of local stone, its simple and compact form and its high integrity. The place makes an important contribution to the built environment of the Greenough district.
