Located on the corner of Padbury and Mills Streets, the Old Police Station and Residence was demolished on 2015, with the site redeveloped for Government housing. The original building addressed Padbury Street and was timber framed building and clad with weatherboards. It had a corrugated iron dutch gable roof which extended at the same pitch to cover the verandah to the front (south) elevation which was supported on timber posts. The roof also extended to cover a side verandah to the east elevation which was partly enclosed with fibro sheeting. The roofscape was punctuated by two red brick chimneys. The Padbury Street elevation, featured three doors which was possibly indicative of the building's former use as both a Police Station and Residence.

During 1912 tenders were called for a new Police Office and Residence for Mullewa, and shortly after this the building was constructed, including a gaol. This building was used as such until 1961 when the new Mullewa Police Station and Courthouse was opened nearby, to the north on Mills Street. In 2015, the weatherboard building was demolished and the site together with the adjoining lot, was redeveloped for the purpose of government housing.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Old Police Station and Residence, now demolished, served the community of Mullewa in the provision of police services for 49 years. The site now redeveloped with new housing, has historic and social significance for the important community role.
