BACKGROUND: During Councils recent "Information Sessions" in September and

> October, there have been discussions on which Roads are permitted to be used for Heavy Vehicle access. Information from the MRWA database has been obtained on what Multi combination vehicles are

permitted to have access to Roads within the Shire of Mullewa.

Approximately 2 years ago MRWA introduced a new system granting certain Restricted Access Vehicles conditional access to specified WA

Roads. The following MRWA information outlines this system –

Western Australia operates many variations of Heavy Vehicle Combinations known as Restricted Access Vehicles (RAV's), including some of the largest road train

combinations in the world.

To improve flexibility and customer service, while maintaining our focus on road safety and the protection of our assets, Main Roads has in place a number of access schemes granting certain RAV's conditional access to specified Western Australian roads. These

access arrangements are controlled by a system where RAV's must operate under operating conditions outlined in a particular permit for that vehicle or combination.

Vehicles up to and including a <u>general access (as of right) vehicle</u> may operate on the road network without need for contact with or permission from Main Roads, and are governed by the <u>Department for Planning and Infrastructure (DPI)</u>.

## **PERMITS**

A permit is an instrument issued by the Commissioner of Main Roads to grant RAV's access to the road network under certain conditions. The permit is issued in accordance with either Clause 25, 30 or 34 of the Road Traffic (Vehicle Standards) Regulations 2002 for the various classes of Restricted Access Vehicles. Permits may allow for increases in dimension or mass, or both. Vehicle operators must apply for permits on a vehicle-byvehicle basis. When an application is approved and a permit subsequently issues, it will include a set of operating conditions.

A fee is charged for each permit that is issued:

## **NOTICES**

A notice is an instrument issued by the Commissioner of Main Roads to grant RAV's access to the road network under certain conditions, without the need for a permit. Notices are published by Main Roads in a <u>Government Gazette</u> and only require and operator of a Restricted Access Vehicle to purchase a Notice from WA State Law Publisher. Notices operate the same as permits and include conditions of use and restrictions on the allowable routes.

## APPROVED ROAD NETWORKS

Permits issued by Main Roads will generally specify an approved road network that a particular vehicle is permitted to travel. In some cases areas a re specified. The approach depends on the type of permit issued.

Specific Journey (Single Trip) permits generally have the route specified on the permit. Period permits on the other hand may refer to Networks.

## **PERMIT NETWORKS**

The Western Australian road network has been divided into ten (10) heavy vehicle networks for notice and permit purposes.

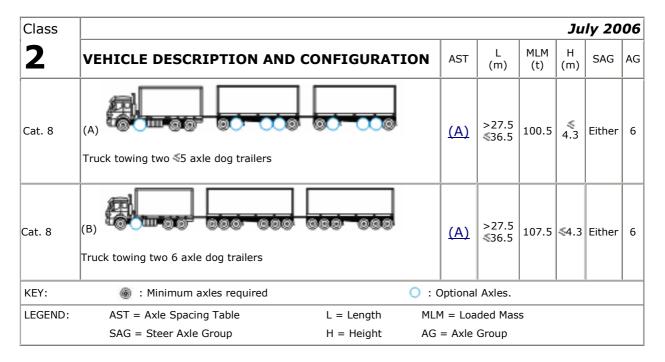
Network 1 is the largest and covers all roads statewide with a list of exceptions. Networks 2 to 10 progressively become more and more restricted. Network 10 is the smallest and covers specified combinations up to 53.5m in length.

COMMENT:

The situation, as it stands, from the information in the MRWA database, is all Roads North of the Geraldton-Mount Magnet Road are approved access for Network 8 vehicles, which includes –

The MRWA data base also revealed that there are <u>no conditions of use</u> specified for access by RAV's on any of Council roads. This effectively means that there is no restriction regarding speed, day/night use, operation on unsealed roads when visibly wet (unless the road has been closed), written approval from Council permitting use of the road, etc. Local Governments can also put conditions on the use of their roads in relation to school bus routes, driving with head lights on, specific cartage only, no through routes, and the list goes on.

Main roads has granted certain RAV's conditional access to specified Western Australian roads through the issue of period permits under the provisions of the Road Traffic (Vehicle Standards) Regulations 2002. Operators must comply with the requirements of the road tables for operating conditions which form part of the permit. It is the operator's responsibility to ensure they have up to date network information on hand when using a RAV. This information is available on a CD or can be downloaded from the MRWA website which permit holders are required to obtain. Each network will include –

- A road table (specifying approved roads and restrictions);
- Road Maps (Visual representation of the Road Table); and
- Information on "How to use the maps".

As can be noted from the above, operators of RAVs can-

- Operate vehicles up to class 2 category 8 on Network 8 for all roads north of the Geraldton/Mount Magnet Highway.
- Operate vehicles up to class 2 category 7 on Network 7 for roads south of the Highway.
- Operate vehicles up to class 2 category 4 on the Wubin-Mullewa road, and
- Operate vehicles up to class 2 category 6 on the Mingenew-Mullewa road.

It must also be noted that the only through road to neighbouring areas linking Network 8 is the Geraldton-Mount Magnet road and for Network 7 is the Geraldton-Mount Magnet road and the Walkaway-Nangetty Road.

Council must now be satisfied that these vehicles should be using the roads, as there is an obligation to ensure the suitability of these routes. Various criteria relating to road width, railway crossings, physical constraints, environmental considerations, other safety considerations and community consultation may need to be assessed. This assessment can be carried out by Bob Roden.

Council also should consider if conditions/restrictions need to be placed on the use of the roads by RAV's.

There is a large map that can be viewed at the meeting which will assist understanding what is in place, as it shows the roads in the Shire, the networks and their links.

In March 2004 records reveal that Council opposed the review by MRWA

to reduce the heavy vehicle multi-combinations from 36.5 metres to 27.5 metres. It would appear that this opposition resulted in the current networks being put in place. Council could "open up a can of worms" if changes are now made.

If Council accept the current situation, as per the Main Roads data, then the existing policies under 1317 will become obsolete.

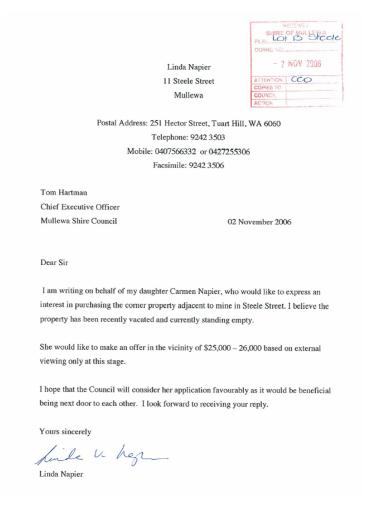

At its Ordinary Meeting on 23 September 2005 the Council resolved to approach the tenant of Lot 13 Steele Street and advise her of Councils intention to sell the property and that any offer over \$25,000 would be considered. At its Ordinary Meeting on 19 October 2005 the Council resolved to sell the property subject to satisfying the requirements of section 3.58 of the Local Government Act. At its Ordinary Meeting in November 2005, Council resolved to sell the property to Mrs Norma Willaway for the sum of \$28,000. In June 2006, Council gave an extension to 31 October 2006 to finalise the transaction. This has not occurred. Council has now received the following offer from Carmen Napier for \$25000 to \$26000.



COMMENT:

If Council was to dispose of the property it would be bound by section 3.58 of the Local Government Act, which in summary states that a local government can only dispose of property to:

- The highest bidder at public auction, or
- The person who at public tender called by the Council makes what is in the opinion of the local government the most acceptable tender whether or not it is the highest tender.

However the local government can dispose of property other than by auction or tender, i.e. by private treaty where it gives state wide notice of the proposed dispositions (that is sale of the property to the individual) and considers such submissions received following that notice.

A valuation was obtained from Mid West Evaluations in mid 2005 which it advised that the property is in fair to poor condition, in need of maintenance and has a market value of between \$22,500 and \$27,000.

This particular property has always been difficult for Council in that whilst was used as a staff residence on occasions it has also been let to the general public. The nature of its construction, its location and its relative isolation has made it on occasions the target of vandalism and damage. It is not suitable as a staff residence would need to be questioned particularly in the light of the valuation advice. Currently with your desire to move towards upgrading of staff residences, serious consideration

should again be given to disposal of the property. The following recommendation will allow the matter to be advertised and will need to be considered again at the December meeting.

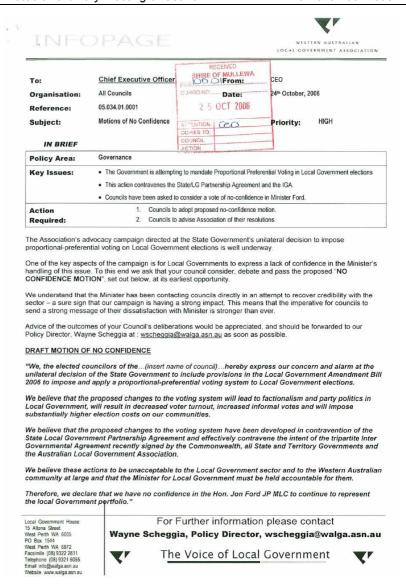
