#### **2.1.** Review of actions from previous meeting:

ACTION: Get mapping from neighbouring Shires to identify standpipe locations - Will be raised at

upcoming DOAC.

OUTCOME: Localised issue between Chiefs to determine most appropriate water source. COMPLETE

ACTION: Investigate possible trial of full face respirators. Potential issues- maintenance, regulation of

internal temperature of wearers, and ability to talk on UHF radios.

OUTCOME: Respirators distributed to Moonyoonooka, Cape Burney and Waggrakine brigades for trial

during upcoming season (Three to each brigade). REVIEW IN FEB/MARCH 2019

**ACTION:** Murray to speak to St John Ambulance to develop a training calendar

OUTCOME: Have liaised with St Johns to develop specialised training for bush fire members. ONGOING

**ACTION:** Scheduling of brigade vehicle servicing.

OUTCOME: Will be covered in General Business. COMPLETE

**ACTION:** Investigate possibility of brigades attending Water Corporation controlled burns.

OUTCOME: Comment from Murray Smith, mitigation works conducted in Kalbarri with WC, DFES, BFB

worked well. COMPLETE

**ACTION:** Working with Children Checks and Police Clearances.

OUTCOME: Formal process for checks not yet in place. Working through logistics of setting up for Volunteer

Bushfire Brigades. Timeframes to be confirmed. Rework of membership forms could be part

of this process. ONGOING

#### 3. REPORTS

#### 3.1. Captains

Mark Teale, Waggrakine Bush Fire Brigade

Busy period. 13 burns conducted. 12 community/social events, 9 callouts.

Membership at 26 people. AGM held 10 June 2018.

Neil Johnstone, Moonyoonooka Bush Fire Brigade

Approx. 12 incidents attended over the past six months. Upcoming burns planned once grass has dried off.

Ian Grant, Eradu Bush Fire Brigade

Nothing to report.

Rob Roffey, Cape Burney Bush Fire Brigade

6 callouts. 4 new members.

Walkaway Bush Fire Brigade

No report as Captain is an apology. Noted however that AGM is scheduled for 19 September 2018.

#### 4. GENERAL BUSINESS

#### 4.1. Current Fire Control Offices

ACTION List of current Fire Control Officers to be distributed before season commences (Murray Smith)

#### 4.2. Servicing

Hose testing and fire blankets have been serviced.

Servicing of Oxy Socks is scheduled.

UHF Radios have been upgraded.

Equipment Audit is complete. All trucks now have full set of gear.

Pre-season inspections – will be conducted by the City of Greater Geraldton Depot Workshop. Servicing will occur on-site at brigade sheds.

#### 4.3. Local Government Grant Scheme

Applications will be submitted for Cape Burney Light Tanker and Bulk Water Tanker.

#### 4.4. 2019/20 New Appliance Program

Six out of twelve trucks are due for replacement in 2018/19 financial year.

Three in current program and three in indicative program – post 2019.

See attachment on replacement schedules.

#### 4.5. City Capital Works Program

Advised that nominations are now open for the City's 2019/20 Capital Works Program. If members have suggestions they should be presented to CGG Fire Services for consideration.

Discussed sites and locations for future Eradu Fire Shed, and renovation of Cape Burney Station.

ACTION: Produce and send updated map of weather stations (Brendan Wilson)

#### 4.6. Prohibited Burning Times

All in consensus that there should be no change to prohibited burning times and dates.

#### 4.7. Engagement of Contractors During Incidents

Log Books to record contractor hours distributed. These are to be used during the coming season to identify and validate incoming invoices from Contractors to ensure fiscal management of the accounts.

Brendan Wilson advised brigades that when a contractor is engaged during an incident, the Chief Bush Fire Control Officer (Murray) should be advised as soon as is practical.

Reiterated that administrative processes are not to hinder fire control activities during an incident.

#### 4.8. Deputy Chief Bush Fire Control Officer

Position currently vacant following the redundancy of Craig Wing.

EOI to be issued in coming weeks. The City is hoping to fill prior to the upcoming fire season.

#### 4.9. Comments from the Floor

QUERY: Rob Roffey – VLO position is vacant. How will that impact on brigades?

RESPONSE: This is a DFES role and not an LG position. This role will be located in the MWG DFES office

and provide support to LG and also assist with incident management support.

QUERY: Rob Roffey – Deployment teams – will this be like last year. I.e. Captains were not aware and

left short staffed.

RESPONSE: Brigade members should be encouraged to consult with the Brigades captain and/or

leadership team to ensure appropriate coverage in their brigade response area.

QUERY: Mark Teale – Waggrakine BFB have identified a high fuel load on the north side of the river,

specifically Kultown Drive, Waggrakine.

**ACTION:** The City is aware of some high fuel loads in the Chapman River Regional Park and will be

working on a program of mitigation with the City's Environmental Team and key CRRP

stakeholders. (Murray Smith)

QUERY: Mark Teale – Noticed that a number of DFES training courses have been cancelled recently

due to low numbers. Waggrakine Brigade are willing to make up numbers if required, so

courses can run. Suggested DFES may advertise vacancies on Facebook etc.

RESPONSE: DFES advised further programs now being programmed to coincide with the end of winter

sporting seasons.

QUERY: Ian Grant – Can CelFi mobile repeater be fitted to Eradu appliance

ACTION: Eradu 4.4 to go to ML Communications on return from Perth to have CelFi mobile repeater

fitted. (Murray Smith).

QUERY: Mark Teale - Reminded attendees of the Rich Maslen / Steve Macdonald Award to nominate

suitable members for this award.


