PROTOCOLS

The Yamaji Yanda Archive Project is a heritage initiative which seeks to build an archival photographic collection of historical images shared by Aboriginal people from the Mid West.

This is a community memories project which will assist in building understanding and appreciation of local Aboriginal cultural identity, while creating a historical database which can be accessed by current and future generations.

All images donated to the Collection will be given the following consideration:

- Images which contain potentially secret/sacred materials must be screened by the appropriate language group before being added.
- Images must not portray very sick/injured/dead persons.
- Images which include nudity must reflect traditional ways of being and cannot be sexualised.
- Family/Deceased Estate of a deceased person may request that digitally recorded images or records be removed from the public collection for cultural reasons if a formal request is made to the City.
