## 5.1. Public Facilities - Discuss Concept Designs

Chris Lee provided background information on the City's work to date to obtain a proposal for 15% engineering design and cost estimates from Smith Sculptors, which has still not been received by the City, despite being first requested in April 2018.

To progress the project, the City now proposes to facilitate development of an agreement between the Smith Sculptors and consulting engineers Arup. The agreement will see the Smith Sculptors lead and manage the design process, with Arup as their nominated subconsultant.

#### **COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION:**

That the City works to progress an agreement between the Smith Sculptors and Arup as proposed, in order to progress the Public Facilities at the Memorial.

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## 6.4. 2018 Memorial Service - Report by Don Rolston

The Warden provided the following feedback on the 2018 Memorial Service:

- Feedback received by the Warden regarding the service has been positive.
- The speaker was very good and enhanced the significance of the Memorial and the importance of the Service. Speeches were well delivered and of relevance to the occasion.
- Bus transport arrangements were excellent and enhanced access to the event. These arrangements are essential for the Service.
- Promotion of the service was excellent, including the use of banners and the program.
- Contribution of the Voluntary Tour Guides and Cadets was excellent.
- PA system was very effective and suitable for the day and windy conditions. Choir and band were well received and their support of the service was acknowledged.
- Wreath laying was too long and meant this element lost impact. This will be addressed in the 2019 service.
- Concerns raised as to length of service. Recommended that future services commence at 5.30pm, rather than 5.00pm. Changes to the wreath laying will also shorten the service.
- The City of Greater Geraldton was acknowledged for its ongoing support of the annual service.

#### Additional comments:

- Stephen Butler on behalf of the RSL acknowledged the success of the service, however noted the length of the service was too long.
- Trevor Ralph on behalf of the Voluntary Tour Guides acknowledged the contribution and organisation of the event, particularly Joanne Panter. Noted the quality of the guest speaker and the valued content of their speech.
