This painted concrete block house has a corrugated iron gambrel roof with a separate gable roof to the front main room and a skillion roof to the rear with a fibro clad extension beyond. The gable end has fibro and timber batten infill with a metal awning to the window below. A separate verandah roof is supported on timber posts. Windows are timber framed double hung and casement in style. There is a corbelled brick chimney and the street boundary has a picket fence to the west and painted concrete block wall to the south.

The house is located on the corner of Alice Street which was named after Alice Clarke according to Council Minutes of 1913. This portion of Fitzgerald Street was originally used as a rifle range, which was gazetted in 1876 for the Volunteer Corp and was probably used as such until around 1905. The rifle range was then moved to the west side of DuBoulay Street. The Fitzgerald Street rifle range went to 300 yards and signs of the targets were still evident until the 1950s.
