Set close to the street boundary, this large stone house has a hipped corrugated iron roof punctuated by a rendered masonry corbelled chimney to the north east. The separate verandah roof to the front facade is hipped, with a section enclosed with fibro and louvre windows. To the south east the verandah has been remodeled to a shallower pitch and is supported on metal posts. The stone work to the front facade is coursed and pointed with random rubble to the sides. The openings of the windows to the south side have been rendered.

This house was built in 1892 by Richard and Harriet Burton (nee Snowdon) from ballast stone originally from Europe. It was subsequently owned by Mrs Enid Bryant (nee Burton).
